FUNERAL SERVICE ASSOCIATION OF CANADA NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION DEADLINE FEBRUARY 28, 2018

ELIGIBILITY

Any registered student attending any recognized Canadian Funeral Service Education program on a full-time basis and in good academic standing.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

1. Letter from applicant's educational institution confirming
 - a. that the applicant is in good standing; and
 - b. that the applicant's instructor has reviewed the submission and can confirm that it meets application criteria.
2. Two written character reference letters;
3. Two copies of the Essay Application, provided in a separate Word document, evoking and demonstrating the behavioural competencies prescribed below (approximately 1500 words);
4. The Essay Application may be submitted in either official language;
5. One blinded copy of the Essay Application (removing applicant's identifiable information). For instructions on blinding visit:

6. Send all information electronically to info@fsac.ca.
7. One unblinded copy of the Essay Application (displaying applicant's information, such as name, address, school, etc.)
8. Verify that spelling and grammar is correct throughout the Essay Application;
9. Applications and supporting material must be received by the application deadline indicated above;
10. No inappropriate language is permitted in the Essay Application;

***** Failure to comply with the Application Guidelines will result in that Essay Application being disqualified. *****

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Education:

Applicant should demonstrate his/her commitment to education specifically his/her Funeral Service Education programming.

Professional Passion:

Applicant should clearly demonstrate his/her passion for a career in Funeral Service and may consider speaking to his/her path of involvement to date.

Community Involvement:

Applicant should highlight in detail his/her involvement with community service:

- Any recognition that has been received should be noted and included.
- Testimonials are welcome.

Integrity:

Applicant should clearly demonstrate how he/she has and intends to uphold both their personal integrity and the integrity of the profession at all crossroads of his/her career.

Teamwork:

Applicants should detail his/her leadership in any team environment and how he/she intends to mirror that leadership in his/her anticipated career.

Excellence:

Finally, the applicant should clearly communicate how he/she has subscribed to and intends to remain true to a path of excellence, as he/she ventures into the Funeral Service profession.

CAVEAT:

Submissions may be published by FSAC and/or a national funeral magazine. It is understood by the applicant that, by submitting their essay, they are authorizing FSAC to publish their work.
